
Fine dining in New York City had become staid. That was one of the provocative ideas that first bonded the chefs Rich Torrisi and Mario Carbone. Friends from culinary school, they reconnected while working for some of the city's most respected restaurants in the first decade of 2000s. Undaunted and eager to make their own mark on the city, they decided to go into business together. Their first restaurant opened in 2009 – a sandwich deli downtown with an ambitious dinner menu named Torrisi Italian Specialties. Word quickly spread about a dining experience unlike any in the city, hailed by critics as a revolution in red-sauce dining. The duo recast classic Italian American dishes, using them as canvases for refined and inventive explorations of flavor. Entrepreneur Jeff Zalaznick took notice and bonded with the chefs over the joy of classic dishes, New York history and their shared ambition to become bombastic restauranteurs. With no shortage of verve and imagination, the trio formed Major Food Group and got to work living

up to their name. No restaurant more than Carbone, which first opened on Thompson Street in 2013, has better exemplified their approach. Stepping inside the darkly lit dining room feels like stepping back in time - to an era when grey-haired waiters wore velvet tuxedos, Frank Sinatra was on the soundtrack, and dinner was the show. Today, the restaurant has become a destination for its impeccably updated classic dishes as much as for the ambiance, brimming over with unabashed nostalgia, vibrant style and extravagance.

Since Carbone cemented its reputation for maximalist excellence, Major Food Group has kept expanding, opening new restaurant concepts, private clubs and hotels that carry the founders' ever-present commitment to old-world hospitality and exceptional food. Today, the group operates two dozen properties in six countries and has embraced Miami as another home, opening locations of their most beloved restaurants in South Beach, the Design District, Coconut Grove and Brickell. Their latest restaurant – a completely new concept with an Italian focus - will serve as the heart and soul of Villa Miami, where residents will be welcomed like regulars.



Major Food Group's influence at Villa Miami extends beyond the food and beverage experiences. Its philosophy of boundless opulence will be felt from the waterfront access to the vast, airy residences equipped with chef-worthy kitchens. And MFG's appreciation for traditional, Italian glamour is reflected in the warm, lush interior design, as well as in Villa Miami's on-staff curator and discerning support staff. The result is waterfront living reimagined for a new Miami - elegant, indulgent and refreshingly familiar.





Before Carbone opened in 2013, Major Food Group's partner Jeff Zalaznick assembled the waiters, also known as captains, and put them through something of a boot camp to practice the art of swanky hospitality, recalling another era of fine dining when waiters had a swagger, authority and dry humor that is

rarely seen in restaurants today. Today, their impeccable, attentive service is central to the entire experience of dining out with Major Food Group. Carbone's captains, dressed sharply in velvet tuxedos, have become characters in what can sometimes feel like a theatrical dining experience, dropping quips as they toss Caesar salads or layer veal parmesan table-side or appearing with a wheel of Parmesan. Tablecloths are always white and crisp. Plates are always presented exquisitely. The experience is always as vivid as the food. That's the Major Food Group way. At Carbone, captains often give dishes a final twist at the table, a beloved tradition that separates the dining experience from any other in fine dining.

The lauded designer lent her vision for exceptional spaces to the exclusive members club for more than a decade before launching her own boutique firm in 2016 where she specializes in a range of hospitality spaces and private residences. While she is known for mixing a laidback glamour with an English country house style, her signature is not as much an aesthetic

one as it is an emotional one. Perfection bores her. Charles embraces charming flaws, knowing that homes are the ultimate stages for active lives and need space to breathe and evolve over time. No wonder highprofile private clients like George and Amal Clooney, Emma Stone, and Harry Styles have relied on her to translate their personal tastes into imaginative, eclectic interiors where functionality is never sacrificed for form.

For her efforts, Charles has become one of the most sought-after designers from London to Hollywood, balancing modern and traditional pieces to create timeless, ease-inducing spaces that exude an intangible sense of belonging and live-able sophistication.



With the Villa Miami spaces and residences, Charles is creating a uniquely European sensibility with noble materials, rich tones and historic inspiration reinterpreted for today. Custom floor patterns of entwining marbles and natural stones run throughout the building, and each residence is wrapped in welcoming, natural materials to complement the glass walls and stunning amount of natural light entering. The result is romantic and warm, unlike anything else in a city defined by white marble and chrome.

Enzo Enea's gardens are designed to dialogue with art and architecture, a synergistic collaboration displayed in this private client's garden.



For Italian landscape architect Enzo Enea, a career in gardens was arguably destined from birth. He comes from a long line of Italian stonemasons and grew up helping his grandfather build outdoor fountains. And he got his start when he joined his father's business decorating gardens with stone and terracotta in the early 1990s. Today, Enea's namesake firm designs imaginative but contemplative green spaces for hotels, churches, residences, and public spaces all over the world, from Miami to Zurich, New York City to the Greek island of Kea. His

clients have included the wife of the King of Bahrain, the Mandarin Oriental in Beverly Hills and the Peninsula Hotel in London. Along the way, Enzo became a prodigious collector of plants. In 2010, he turned his collection of trees, some of which are more than 100 years old, into the world's first Tree Museum near his headquarters in Switzerland, in Upper Lake Zurich, on land leased from a nearby convent. The museum is open to the public and welcomes more than 30,000 visitors a year.

From private spaces to public promenades, Enea always approaches with the same overarching philosophy: experiential green spaces composed of native plants, in beautiful conversation with the surrounding landscape. Creating a layered experience and story from the undergrowth to the canopy heights, his work can be likened to painting or composing with greenery with living layers complementing each other and coming in and out of bloom year round.



Enea's design approach prioritizes integration, not decoration, responding to the unique factors of every project, from the microclimate to the architecture. Today, he is especially known for his work in Miami, where he has a satellite office, and where his synergistic approach can be found throughout the Villa Miami grounds.

Since its inception, O'Donnell Dannwolf & Partners—helmed by founder and president Kurt Dannwolf—has practiced a holistic, fullservice approach to architecture in Florida. An ODP project goes beyond specs and budgets to consider the history of the site,

the current state of play with materials and sustainability, and the emotions of the new building's inhabitants.

In his nearly 30-year career, architect Kurt Dannwolf has created some of the most recognizable skyscrapers in Southern Florida, including the Four Seasons Hotel & Tower in Miami, the Dacom Headquarters in Korea, and the Telecom Headquarters in Buenos Aires. His firm, ODP Architecture and Design, is also a frequent collaborator with international visionaries with special projects in the region. Dannwolf served as the architect of record for the award-winning One Thousand Museum luxury tower, the last building designed by the late British architect Zaha Hadid, and the Towers at 1201 Brickell, designed by Fosters & Partners, among many other projects. Today, ODP has offices in Hollywood, Florida, as well as Fort Lauderdale and Tampa, and is recognized as an expert in Floridian waterfront living.

ODP's work spans genres, ranging from cutting-edge commercial work for the likes of Apple, to public works and lush private residences. The principles that define ODP Architects' design ethos—dynamic problemsolving and a holistic interpretation of how life is best lived—most often coalesces around Miami's new high-rise residential buildings. One Thousand Museum, One Bayfront Plaza II, and now Villa are redefining architectural excellence in Miami.

David Martin is the kind of developer who doesn't just think about buildings, but about neighborhoods. Born and raised in Miami, Martin founded Terra in 2001 with his father, a banking and real estate corporate attorney.

After the 2008 financial crisis, the younger Martin pivoted his approach to development and has since established a reputation for embracing a "less is more" approach, considering the history, surrounding public space, infrastructure and density of the places where he invests and taking a long view to urban development.

Under Terra's stewardship, Miami neighborhoods such as Coconut Grove and now Edgewater – have evolved into newly vibrant communities complete with luxury residences, world-class dining, and active art scenes. When developing a building, the team approaches with the intent of transforming and improving life for the surrounding residents, not simply the building's inhabitants, whether this means cultivating public parks and gathering spaces, improving the streetscape, or creating opportunities for retail and dining to flourish nearby.

Today, Terra counts about 100 employees and more than \$4 billion developed since the firm began, often the fruits of partnerships with the world's most prestigious architects and designers. Projects include a diversified mix of residential, commercial, multi-family and mixed-use developments – including Five Park, Mr. C Residences, Grove Central, Miami Beach Convention Center Hotel, Upland Park and Natura Gardens — that are recognized both for their inspired designs and their positive influence on the communities that surround them.



At Regalia, the Sunny Isles luxury condominium tower co-developed by One Thousand Group's Kevin Venger, each floor is lined by undulating verandas that give the building its distinctive shape.



"Real estate developers are the new curators." That's the mantra behind the newly formed One Thousand Group — a partnership between Louis Birdman, Kevin Venger and Michael Konig — signaling their ambitious vision for the future of Miami as a global city on the brink of a new chapter of expansion. Their namesake project is the historic and award-winning One Thousand Museum,

which opened on Biscayne Boulevard downtown in 2019. The 62-story building is the last project from the innovative mind of Zaha Hadid, the late Iraqi British architect known for her futuristic designs and curving façades. One Thousand Museum is one of the most complex skyscrapers ever built and has become an iconic symbol of the rapidly changing Miami skyline.

In recent years, Venger and Birdman, two of the developers behind One Thousand Museum, joined forces with Michael Konig to tackle a range of world-class buildings in prime locations across the city. The trio brings together decades of experience across innumerable residential and commercial projects. Venger co-developed the oceanfront ultra-luxury condominium tower Regalia and Paramount on the Bay in Edgewater. His other projects include the Ten Museum Park Condominium and the Four Seasons Hotel and Tower Miami. Birdman, an architect by training, has developed dozens and dozens of projects nationwide, including Emerald Brickell, Vue on Brickell and Davinci Coral Gables in the Miami area. Finally Konig, whose career includes stints in finance and marketing, developed 1110 Brickell Avenue, 1680 Michigan Avenue and 11900 Biscayne, among many other projects. With Villa Miami, One Thousand Group is expanding its deepening its investment in Edgewater, a neighborhood uniquely positioned to relish in the dynamism of the city now and in the years to come.

These are just some of the images that were on the mind of designer Vicky Charles as she embarked on creating an aesthetic vision for Villa Miami that imbues a rich intensity unlike anything else in a city long defined by Art Deco, white marble and chrome.



Designer Vicky Charles spent more than a decade designing exceptional space for Soho House, and is now one of the most sought-after interior designers from London to Hollywood.



Instead, Charles looked to coastal European cities, where the romance of the water's edge merges with a cosmopolitan sophistication. Villa Miami's interiors reflect the languid glamour of those towns. There, style is infused in even the most quotidian of daily rituals and the traditions of food and family are celebrated regularly.

Charles also took cues from the ornate Milanese estate Villa Necchi Campiglio, built in the 1930s and designed by Italian architect Piero Portaluppi. The home quickly became the party spot of its time, dazzling guests with the austere glamour of its patterned travertine and marble floors and private outdoor pool, a rarity in those days. Today, the villa is considered an icon of Italian rationalism, beloved by design enthusiasts for its embrace of contrasts, mixing classicism with modern architecture. It has appeared in films such as "I Am Love" and "House of Gucci."




Charles chose materials with rich histories, like textured Zellige tiles, that transform interiors into artisanal worlds.

With these references in mind, Charles prioritized hefty materials with integrity and grit like wood and granite, but arranged in timeless shapes and clean lines that serve as a canvas for the many lives that will take shape within the Villa Miami's

walls. The throughline is a deep warmth in color, materials and design that create otherworldly spaces. A green, brackish travertine is transformed into an intricate pattern Villa Miami's sprawling lobby floor, connecting grandeur of the building's exterior with the Italian-inspired glamour of its interiors. Heading upstairs, full-bodied tones in leathers, stones and grass cloth evoke a refined spirit of relaxation and indulgence throughout the club's great room, private dining areas and plush screening room. These spaces are designed for both celebrations and quiet conversations, for sinking into the comfort of a place that feels both nostalgic in its familiarity but modern in its ingenuity.

In Villa Miami's pool deck and spa, inspired by the thermal spas on the Italian island of Ischia, rich greens and browns give way to milky whites and soft aquas, a palette chosen to respond to Miami's natural light and imbue a serene tranquility. On the pool deck, lush hedges and canopy trees line the deck and frame the perennial sunlight, setting the stage for breathtaking tableaus that would have enchanted Slim Aarons.

FROM SUNRISE TO SUNSET, A LIFE DESIGNED AROUND THE HORIZON



A gemstone rises, sparkling, from the edge of the bay, as striking when seen from miles away as it is when viewed from the waterfront below. This is Villa Miami's most prominent contribution to its city, an instant landmark whose geometric facade was inspired by the way light bounces off water, designed to resemble the refractive edges of a gemstone through its "bubbles" of glass. Angled glass facades undulate in and out, offering a geometric expression of ripples in the water and cut with a precision designed to recall the surface of a diamond. The distinct copper exoskeleton encases the towering diamond, a reminder that this building is as innovative as it is daring.


For the team at ODP Architects, Villa Miami's 360° views represented privilege and a priority. Every entry point, whether to the residences or the grand lobby, is positioned to feature a straight view of the water, the lights of Miami or the far-stretching beaches beyond. Similarly, the building's landscape design prioritizes the breathtaking bayfront. Verdant textures define Villa Miami's grand entrance, flanked by large, diverse canopy trees that offer shade and character and frame a view of the water as soon as residents turn off Biscayne Boulevard. At the base of the building, landscape architect Enzo Enea created a series of private gardens, filled with native flowering trees and designed to offer moments of contemplation.
